• Summer School/Virtual School Update – Mrs. Williamson said approximately 861 students are currently taking advantage of summer learning activities this summer. She said this includes students taking credit recovery courses, enrichment courses, and summer school. Dr. Firn added there are also students involved in summer reading programs. Dr. Firn said he will give another update at the end of summer.

 - Rev. Rollins asked if the section on reimbursing someone for the personal use of their car based upon the schools' availability of funds could be removed so when someone is asked to use their personal car for business related reasons, they would be reimbursed if the system had the money. Chair Davis said the change could be made, but it would need to lie on the table for another 30 days. Dr. Firn said if the system requires it and it is part of their job responsibility then we have an obligation and a duty to reimburse. Rev. Rollins said under 2A, he would like "limits of the budget" to be removed. Dr. Firn said he may not remove that wording but possibly their job performance would need to be modified. Dr. Firn said he will make that change and present this policy in July. Jackie Huntley withdrew her motion to approve the Travel Policy. Chair Davis said the Travel policy will again lie on the table for 30 days and will possibly be approved at the July meeting.
